

+Scholarships for Architecture Students+

1. American Institute of Architecture Students / AIA Trust Scholarship for Emerging Professionals

Scholarship program designed to assist financially-challenged students with paying tuition and other direct educational expenses. Up to six scholarships of \$750 each. Students must be in the fifth year of an undergraduate professional degree program or the first year of a graduate professional degree program.

2. American Institute of Architects/American Architectural Foundation Minority/Disadvantaged Scholarship

For minority high school seniors and college freshmen enrolled in a NAAB-accredited program. Twenty awards are made each year in amounts ranging from \$500 to \$2,500 and can be renewed for two additional years.

3. Zimmer Gunsul Frasca Scholarship

\$10,000 annual stipend awarded to a student in the fifth year of a NAAB-accredited Bachelor of Architecture program or pursuing a Master of Architecture degree. The scholarship award includes the offer of summer internship at one of ZGF's offices in Portland, Seattle, Los Angeles, or Washington DC.

4. Association for Women in Architecture

Cash award to women students studying architecture or allied professions. Applicants must be residents of California or attending a California school and must have completed at least 18 credits of work in their major.

5. Simpson Strong-Tie Structural Engineering / Architecture Student Scholarship

Applicants must be juniors or seniors (completed at least 60 credits) in a full-time undergraduate course of study in architecture or structural engineering at specified colleges. Up to 50 \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded each year.

8. AIA/ a/e Pro Net David W. Lakamp AIA Scholarship

One \$2,500 annual award presented to a student demonstrating a strong interest in practice management. Applicants must have completed the third year of a NAAB-accredited professional degree program, or the third year of a four-year pre-professional degree program accepted for direct admission to a NAAB-accredited MArch program, or one year of a NAAB-accredited Master of Architecture program.

9. Corporate Architects and Facility Management Scholarship

For students enrolled in a NAAB-accredited school of architecture. Applicants must be in the third or fourth year of a five-year BArch program; the fourth or fifth year of a six-year BArch/MArch program, or the second or third year of a Master of Architecture program if the applicant's undergraduate degree is in a discipline other than architecture.

10. Center for Architecture Foundation Women's Auxiliary Eleanor Allwork Scholarship

Students must be seeking their first professional degree in architecture from a NAAB-accredited school in New York. Multiple awards of up to \$7,500 each will be given to students demonstrating academic achievement and financial need.

+TRAVEL FELLOWSHIPS for students and graduates of architecture programs+

1. The Gabriel Prize

\$20,000 grant for three months of study of classical architecture in France.

2. The Architectural League of New York Deborah J. Norden Fund

Grants of up to \$5,000 to architecture students and recent graduates for travel.

3. Van Alen Institute New York Prize Fellowship

Grants for early- to mid- career practitioners for research during a three months continuous residency in New York City. Awardees must complete a publically accessible research project.

4. Rotch Traveling Scholarship

Provides funds for studies in foreign countries. Candidates must be U.S. citizens under 35 years old on January 1 of the competition year, and must have a professional degree (BArch/MArch) from an accredited U.S. school of architecture and one year of full-time professional experience in a Massachusetts architecture firm as of January 1 of the competition year; or a professional degree (BArch/MArch) from an accredited Massachusetts school of architecture and one year of full-time professional experience in any architecture firm as of January 1 of the competition year.

5. SOM Foundation Architecture, Design & Urban Design Prize

\$50,000 research and travel fellowship for research, collaboration with other designers, and independent study. Graduating undergraduate and graduate students of accredited U.S. schools of Architecture, Design and Urban Design are eligible.

6. Steedman Fellowship

Open to citizens of all countries with no more than eight years experience following receipt of a professional degree in architecture. The competition carries a \$30,000 first-place award to support study and research abroad.

7. Berkeley Prize Travel Fellowship

Travel stipend which generally covers three weeks of study and travel abroad. Applicants must submit a proposal for their plan of study and itinerary.

Six-month fellowship for study of architecture and historic preservation in France.

Only alumni of the Carnegie Mellon School of Architecture are eligible to receive the award. There is no age restriction, but targeted toward early or mid-career architects.

10. The Lyceum Fellowship

Travel grants during the students' academic study years. All competitors are required to have at least one year of study remaining so that a travel award may be completed prior to the final year of all architectural studies.

The award provides time, space, and an inspiring environment to artists of exceptional talent at its facility in New Hampshire. A MacDowell Fellowship, or residency, consists of exclusive use of a studio, accommodations, and three prepared meals a day for up to eight weeks.
